

The project «"You, I, He, She = Europe" » was funded with the support of the European Union under the Programme "Europe for Citizens"

Participation: The project involved 320 citizens, notably 230 participants from the town of Visky (**Czech republic**), 16 participants from the town of Kirchlinteln (**Germany**), 26 participants from the town of Ladomerská Vieska (**Slovakia**), 30 participants from the town of Vieska (**Slovakia**), 18 participants from the town of Mosonszolnok (**Hungary**).

Location/ Dates: The event took place in Visky, Czech Republic from 27/08/2021 to 29/08/2021

Short description:

The day of 27/08/2021 was important in terms of getting to know each other among the participants and getting to know the home community. This also established the direction of other activities. The EU gave a lecture outlining its history and role in the world. There was also a discussion about its role. As a result, European awareness has grown. The Retirement Club paved the way for the active involvement of seniors and highlighted their role in society. The screened films contributed to the development of tolerance...

The day of 28/08/2021 was held in a spirit of solidarity and culture. First, there was a joint negotiation, which brought new visions for the direction of the partnership. Solidarity was discussed and the citizens got to know it. The workshop on volunteering aroused in the participants the desire to act voluntarily and to help voluntarily. Culture has raised citizens from different countries to a different level. Partners from abroad introduced themselves, which supported the transfer of cultural traditions.

Day 29/08/2021 began with the presentation of important information on EU initiatives. It was information about its benefits or offers for citizens. This appealed primarily to young people, who were given the opportunity to take an active part in it in the future. Adults and seniors were offered a glimpse of their own importance, a benefit to ordinary people. Culture has helped to overcome barriers and bring together citizens from different countries. Citizens have made their own banner "on their knees", which is a reminder of the event and an example of good practice.
