<b>Description</b> <i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>The “DIP” project was implemented through one separate event. It was organized in the municipality of Kráľová pri Senci (Slovakia). Its main theme was a discussion on various local government topics and problems. The event consisted of a series of activities - workshops, education, discussions, exchange and dissemination of good practices, awareness-raising and presentation activities. All participants were involved in these types of activities, regardless of age or gender. Gender equality and non-discrimination were promoted.</p>

**Agenda/brief description of the event:**

The aim of the event was to strengthen the international partnership of municipalities. Its task was to bring discussion to various self-government topics and problems. At the same time, its task was to provide a space for deeper knowledge of the EU and the cultural diversity of partners, as well as a space for discussion on current topics and problems (environmental protection, gender equality, solidarity and volunteering). The course of the event was as follows:

The first day, 05/09/2025, activities focused on presenting the project, the CERV Programme, the expected outcomes and addressing the issue of Euroscepticism and gender equality. The activities brought learning about the successes and assistance of the EU, exchange of experiences with the refugee crisis, discussion on gender inequality in rural areas. A discussion and exchange of experiences was held.

The second day, 06/09/2025, activities focused on increasing awareness of the European Union. This was done through workshops and dissemination of information. The concept of solidarity in rural areas and its practical cases, such as volunteering and solidarity with marginalized groups, was also introduced. An important point was getting to know the cultural and linguistic diversity of the nations present.

The third day, 07/09/2025, activities focused on youth and seniors and brought them to know the benefits of the EU. The activities were stimulated by a discussion about what kind of Europe these groups imagine. An important point was getting to know the cultural and linguistic diversity of the nations present.

The event program was implemented as: workshops, trainings, discussions, presentations, awareness-raising activities, exchange and dissemination of good practices, communication activities.

**Achievements:**

- Strengthening the partnership through the exchange of information and experience
- Highlighting current topics - gender equality, solidarity, the environment and ensuring international public debate on them
- Supporting the EU and the fight against Euroscepticism
- Connecting four nations through a festival of culture, learning about linguistic diversity
- Highlighting the benefits of the EU for ordinary citizens
- Supporting solidarity and gender equality in rural areas

**Information on the main topics of the event:**

*Supporting solidarity* - implemented activities were aimed at exchanging know-how in solving the refugee crisis, cooperation with marginalized groups. Volunteering and solidarity in practice were presented. With these steps, we provided citizens of 4 countries with incentives for active citizenship.

*Fighting Euroscepticism* – workshops and discussions about the EU and its future were held. We talked about specific support for individual partner municipalities, i.e. what projects the EU co-financed in partner municipalities. We also discussed with young people and seniors what kind of Europe they imagine, and how the EU specifically helps them. With these steps, we fought Euroscepticism and at the same time supported the rapprochement of citizens with the EU.

*Cultural and linguistic diversity* – presentation activities were held aimed at overcoming prejudices and breaking down barriers. I.e. the culture of four nations was presented, as well as their language. In this way, we supported the connection of nations and broke down national prejudices.

*Support for equality and non-discrimination* – activities were held for all generations and genders. We added the topic of gender equality as one of the main activities of the project. The overall concept of the project was built on gender equality in participation and non-discrimination on the basis of gender or age. We addressed gender equality in rural areas from the perspective of, for example, the representation of women in local government.
